How can we create interest, tension, and contrast?

- Build the verse and chorus using different grooves/rhythmic feel.
- Use different chord progressions in the verse and in the chorus (also for the bridge if you have one).
- Alter the melody in the different sections of the song.
- If the verse is wordy, make the chorus sparse, or vice versa.
- Make the words feel genuine, like the way we speak in conversation and everyday exchanges with people.

## EXERCISE:

Choose some songs on your song list. Take a look at:

- 1. Form
- 2. The Title
- 3. Verses, Pre-Choruses (if any), Choruses, Bridges (if any)
- 4. Is there a pre-chorus? If so, how many measures?
- Is there a bridge? If so, how does the writer differentiate the bridge from the rest of the sections? (lyrically? musically?)
- 6. How does the chorus differ from the verse?
- Count how many measures are in each of the following sections: intro, verse, pre-chorus (if there is one), chorus, bridge (if there is one).
- 8. How does the melody differ in each of the sections? How do the chords progress and contrast between sections?
